An Act To Allow a Voter To Preserve the Confidentiality of That Voter's Presence at the Polls

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §671, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2005, c. 453, §55, is further amended to read:

1. Name announced. A voter who wishes to vote must state the voter's name and, upon request, residence address to an election clerk who shall announce the name in a loud, clear voice <u>except that</u>, upon the request of a voter, the election clerk may not announce that voter's name.

SUMMARY

This bill allows a voter to request that an election clerk not announce that voter's name.
