#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Health and Human Services will require General Fund appropriations of \$1,245,517 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$1,380,474 in fiscal year 2018-19 for the increased costs generated by elimination of the requirement to apply for and receive a certificate of need from the Department of Health and Human Services before introducing additional health care services and procedures into a market area. Federal Expenditures Fund allocations for the FMAP match and Other Special Revenue Funds allocations for the Nursing Facilities Tax are also required.
