Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 610, subsection 6, paragraph B, an amendment to Rule Chapter 28 necessary to implement the requirements of this section is routine technical rulemaking as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A and must be adopted and in effect no later than January 1, 2012.'

27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	The bill repeals the statutory requirement that the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, Board of Pesticides Control establish a registry of persons who request to receive advance notification of the outdoor application of pesticides; the registry applies to notification of agricultural pesticide applications. The board, by rule, also established a registry of persons who request to receive advance notification of the outdoor application of nonagricultural pesticides, known as the Maine Pesticide Notification Registry.
