3 SUMMARY

This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.

This bill would amend the current law regarding electricity restructuring and retail electricity sales, replacing the State's default service, called standard-offer service, with full retail choice and competition to benefit consumers and help to deliver the jobs, economic development and other benefits of a fully competitive market. The bill would ensure that all retail customers have adequate and efficient billing for electric service, increase the use of renewable and carbon-free resources in electricity generation, allow consumers to choose a rate that works for them from a mix of time-of-use rates and encourage innovative and broad on-bill financing programs to assist consumers with implementing beneficial electrification to help Maine achieve its climate goals.
