An Act To Require That School Administrative Units Establish a Mission Statement for Each of the Public Schools Operated by the School Administrative Unit

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1001, sub-§19 is enacted to read:

<u>19. Mission statement.</u> A school board shall adopt a mission statement for each
school under its jurisdiction. The school board shall solicit input from teachers,
administrators, parents, students and community members in the development and
adoption of a mission statement under this subsection.

7 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §4502, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2001, c. 454, §12, is 8 further amended to read:

Elementary and secondary schools and school 9 1. General requirements. administrative units, including an educational program or school located in or operated by 10 a juvenile correctional facility, shall meet all requirements of the system of learning 11 results as established in section 6209 as well as other requirements of this Title and other 12 statutory requirements applicable to the public schools and basic school approval 13 14 standards. Each school administrative unit shall prepare and implement a comprehensive 15 education plan that is aligned with the system of learning results, focused on the learning of all students and oriented to continuous improvement. This plan must address all plans 16 17 required by the department, including a mission statement adopted by the school 18 administrative unit's school board pursuant to section 1001, subsection 19 for every school of the school administrative unit. 19

- 20 Sec. 3. Rules. The Commissioner of Education may adopt rules to carry out the 21 purposes of this Act. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules 22 under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
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SUMMARY

This bill requires a school board to adopt a mission statement for every school under its jurisdiction. In developing and adopting a mission statement, a school board must solicit input from teachers, administrators, parents, students and community members. The mission statement must be included in the comprehensive education plan required from all school administrative units, and is subject to review as part of the annual report to the Commissioner of Education on the progress of implementing the plan.
