1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	5. Preemption: exception. Except as provided in this subsection, a municipality or other political subdivision may not enact an ordinance or other rule purporting to have the force of law under its home rule or other authority regulating the minimum hourly wage paid by an employer or requiring adjustments to the minimum hourly wage for hazard pay. A municipality or other political subdivision may enact an ordinance or other rule purporting to have the force of law under its home rule authority regulating a minimum hourly wage or requiring adjustments to the minimum hourly wage for hazard pay if the ordinance applies only to employees of the municipality or other political subdivision.
11 12 13 14 15	SUMMARY This bill prohibits a municipality from enacting an ordinance governing the minimum hourly wage paid by an employer or requiring adjustments to the minimum hourly wage for hazard pay. The bill provides an exception to the prohibition that allows a municipality to regulate the minimum hourly wage and hazard pay of municipal employees.
