| 20 21 22 | 1. It clarifies the provision allowing registered caregivers and dispensaries to transfer to and accept from another registered caregiver or a dispensary an unlimited amount of their marijuana plants and harvested marijuana in a wholesale transaction. |
| 23 24 | 2. It removes provisions adding a fee structure for a caregiver cultivating based upor plant canopy. |
