19 20 21 22	1. Appointment; composition. The Advisory Council on Senior Housing, referred to in this section as "the council" and established by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 34-A, consists of the following members, appointed by the director of the Maine State Housing Authority, referred to in this section as "the director," unless otherwise specified:				
23 24	<u>A.</u> A representative of a state association that advocates on behalf of elderly residents:				
25 26	B. A representative of a national organization that advocates on behalf of the elderly population;				
27	C. A representative of a state organization that advocates for affordable housing;				
28	D. A representative of a state organization that advocates for low-income residents;				
29 30	E. A representative of a state organization that advocates for low-income elderly residents;				
31 32	F. A representative of a state organization that advocates for individuals with disabilities;				

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1	G. A municipal or regional planner;

A term of a member of the council appointed by the director is 2 years, except a vacancy of a member before the expiration of the member's term must be filled in the same manner as the original member for the unexpired portion of the member's term. A legislative member serves during the term of office for which the member was elected.
19 20 21 22	3. Advisory group of federal agency representatives. The council may form an advisory group of federal agency representatives that may include representatives of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and the United States Department of Agriculture's rural development authority.
23 24 25	4. Meetings. The council shall meet at least 4 times per year at a time and location determined by the director, except that the council is not required to meet more than twice in 2017.
26 27 28 29	5. Duties. The council shall make recommendations to the director for the development of a strategic housing plan enabling elderly residents of the State to live in affordable, safe housing as they age. In developing its recommendations under this subsection, the council shall:
30 31	<u>A. Review existing data, reports and other materials to determine the unmet need for affordable housing units for elderly residents;</u>
32 33 34	B. Assess the financial burden of home modifications or repairs necessary to allow elderly residents to remain in their homes, including elderly residents whose income is at or below the area median income for their county or metropolitan area; and
35 36 37	C. Identify innovative strategies employed either within the State or by other states to improve the ability of elderly residents to remain in their homes or to secure alternative housing of their choice.
38 39 40 41	6. Strategic housing plan. The director shall develop by January 1, 2023 a strategic housing plan enabling elderly residents of the State to live in affordable, safe housing as they age. The strategic plan must set forth the recommendations submitted by the council under subsection 5 and a summary of the information gathered by the council under

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1 subsection 5 in support of those recommendations. The strategic plan must also include plans for meeting the unmet need for affordable housing units for elderly residents in the 2 State and the financial resources that may be used to alleviate the financial burden of 3 home modifications necessary to allow elderly residents of the State, including elderly 4 residents whose income is at or below the area median income for their county or 5 6 metropolitan area, to remain in their homes.

7 7. Report. The director shall submit a report regarding the development or implementation of the strategic housing plan described in subsection 6 to the joint 8 9 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters on or 10 before March 15th of the first regular session of each Legislature.

SUMMARY

14 This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft. This amendment 15 establishes the Advisory Council on Senior Housing to study the unmet need for affordable housing units for elderly residents of the State as well as the financial burden 16 of home modifications and repairs necessary to enable the State's elderly residents to 17 remain in their homes. The council is directed to make recommendations to the director 18 of the Maine State Housing Authority for the development by January 1, 2023 of a 19 strategic housing plan enabling elderly residents of the State to live in affordable, safe 20 21 housing as they age. The director is directed to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters on the development or 22 23 implementation of the strategic housing plan by March 15th of the first regular session of 24 each Legislature. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
