18 19 20 21 22 23 24	This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, changes from 14 years of age to 12 years of age the age of a minor who may consent to treatment for abuse of alcohol or drugs or for emotional or psychological problems. It removes the provision that prevents a minor from abrogating the consent of the minor's parent or guardian. The bill provides that a parent or guardian may not abrogate the consent to treatment provided by a minor 14 years of age or older; the amendment changes that age to 12 years of age or older.
