An Act To Increase Transparency in Cooperative Agreements within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- 2 Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §9, as amended by PL 1973, c. 44, is further amended to read:
- **3** §9. Cooperative agreements or arrangements

4 The commissioner department may enter into cooperative agreements or cooperative 5 arrangements, in accordance with this section, with a state or federal agency or with any person, firm or corporation for the purpose of controlling diseases of plants and domestic 6 7 animals, advertising and increasing the sale and consumption of Maine food products or 8 disseminating information concerning the grade, quality or condition of same Maine food 9 products, and supplying inspection and grading services with respect to such Maine food 10 He The department may receive, administer and disburse any funds or products. contributions from such a state or federal agency, person, firm or corporation, either 11 independently or in conjunction with state funds allocated to said that purpose. Funds so 12 13 contributed shall in accordance with this section do not lapse at the end of any fiscal year 14 but shall be are carried forward to be used for the purpose originally intended.

15 **1. Public notice.** The department shall provide public notice of each proposed 16 cooperative agreement or arrangement by posting on the department's publicly accessible 17 website a detailed description of each cooperative agreement or arrangement proposed or 18 entered into during the previous fiscal year. The description and notice must include the 19 expected benefits to the State, the department, the regulated community and the public 20 and must include a solicitation of public comments.

21 2. Solicitation of comments; response. The department shall solicit public comments on a proposed cooperative agreement or arrangement for which notice is 22 provided in accordance with subsection 1, and shall provide responses to questions and 23 24 comments from the public and interested parties to the best of the department's 25 knowledge. If a person submits in writing a request that the department decline to receive future funding from a cooperative agreement or arrangement, the department shall 26 consider the request, determine whether the benefits of the cooperative agreement or 27 28 arrangement outweigh the person's concerns and inform the person in writing of the 29 department's decision.

30 3. Annual report. No later than March 1st annually, the department shall report to
 31 the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural
 32 matters regarding the cooperative agreements and arrangements entered into in
 33 accordance with this section during the previous fiscal year.

4. Public hearing. Upon receipt of the annual report submitted in accordance with
 subsection 3, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
 agricultural matters may schedule a public hearing on any cooperative agreement or
 arrangement about which the committee has questions.

SUMMARY

2 This bill amends the law governing cooperative agreements and arrangements entered 3 into by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry for the purpose of 4 controlling diseases of plants and domestic animals and advertising or disseminating 5 information concerning Maine food products. This bill requires the department to:

6 1. Provide public notice of each proposed cooperative agreement or arrangement;

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7 2. Solicit public comments and provide responses regarding proposed cooperative
8 agreements or arrangements;

9 3. Consider requests submitted in writing to decline to receive future funding from a 10 cooperative agreement or arrangement; and

4. Report annually to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
 jurisdiction over agricultural matters regarding the cooperative agreements and
 arrangements entered into during the previous fiscal year.

Under the bill, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
 over agricultural matters may schedule a public hearing on any cooperative agreement or
 arrangement about which the committee has questions.
