1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §713, sub-§2, ¶B is enacted to read:
3 4	<u>B.</u> This subsection does not prohibit delivery of malt liquor by a small brewery or contractor of a small brewery under section 1355-A, subsection 3, paragraph F.
5	Sec. 2. 28-A MRSA §1355-A, sub-§3, ¶F is enacted to read:
6 7 8 9 10	F. A holder of a small brewery license may deliver to a customer for off-premises consumption a container of malt liquor produced by the brewery allowed to be delivered under paragraph B, subparagraph (2). Delivery may be made only to an individual 21 years of age or older who provides acceptable identification under section 706. The holder may contract with a 3rd party to perform delivery under this paragraph.
11	Sec. 3. 28-A MRSA §2073-D, sub-§2, ¶E is enacted to read:
12 13	<u>E.</u> A holder of a small brewery license or contractor of the holder may deliver malt liquor under section 1355-A, subsection 3, paragraph F.
14	SUMMARY
15 16 17	This bill allows a small brewery or a 3rd-party contractor of a small brewery to deliver containers of malt liquor produced by the brewery to a customer 21 years of age or older who provides acceptable identification.
