23	This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary.
24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	This amendment replaces the provision in the bill that prohibited any person from interfering with intrastate goods and services and created Class C and Class D crimes. This amendment prohibits a state official or employee from enforcing a federal law that regulates or attempts to regulate goods grown, manufactured or made in this State or services performed in this State when those goods or services are sold, maintained, retained or performed exclusively in this State, unless the official or employee is authorized to do so by state law. This amendment also directs state courts to not give force or effect to any action by a state official or employee that is inconsistent with the prohibition.
