6 7 This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. The amendment changes the definition of "custom vehicle" to include a motor vehicle that is at least 25 years old instead of at least 30 years old as in current law. The amendment also raises the weight limit for a custom vehicle from the current 6,000 pounds to 10,000 pounds. The amendment clarifies that a custom vehicle is subject to motor vehicle inspection standards except as provided by rules adopted by the Chief of the State Police, which provide certain exemptions for custom vehicles.
