22 SUMMARY

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This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, narrows the medically tailored and nutrition interventions demonstration waiver program to individuals who are being released from the hospital, are at risk of readmission and have received a doctor's recommendation that certain elements of nutrition or foods are necessary for the patient's health. Patients offered medically tailored food and nutrition interventions may receive one meal per day for up to 7 days. The amendment also requires the Department of Health and Human Services to reimburse under the MaineCare program for medical nutritional therapy for certain conditions on a pilot basis. The Department of Health and Human Services must report annually for 5 years on the medically tailored food and nutritional interventions demonstration program and the medical nutritional therapy pilot program.

The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
