Amend the bill in Part A by striking out all of section 2 and inserting the following:

'Sec. A-2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Initiative: Provides funding to strengthen mental health peer support services by providing funding for the statewide crisis line and statewide so-called intentional warmline 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The department shall provide for mobile outreach peer support specialists,

 2 officer liaisons colocated in law enforcement agencies and community debriefing and
 3 critical incidence response services to the existing crisis services response system. The
 4 department shall also provide for ancillary services that are required components of mental
 5 health crisis intervention mobile response services. The funding for these ancillary services
 6 must include travel costs to and from mobile face-to-face assessments not to exceed the
 7 federal per mile rate, travel time to and from mobile face-to-face assessments and
 8 reimbursement for time spent on telephone conferences with clients. The department shall
 9 provide reimbursement for peer support services provided as mental health crisis
 10 intervention mobile response services under the MaineCare program.

27 **Sec. C-1. Strengthen mental health crisis residential services.** The
28 Department of Health and Human Services shall strengthen mental health crisis residential
29 services in order to provide services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The department shall
30 provide for certified intentional peer support specialists and recovery coaches as part of
31 mental health crisis residential services and such other resources and services as are
32 determined to be needed in each public health district. The department shall work with
33 organizations providing mental health crisis residential services, law enforcement agencies
34 and other stakeholders to determine the resources available in each public health district
35 and the resources and services needed. Beginning January 1, 2022, the department shall
36 provide reimbursement for peer support services provided as mental health crisis residential
37 services under the MaineCare program.

29 **SUMMARY**

30 This amendment makes the following changes to the bill.

31 1. It removes references to and funding for E-9-1-1 dispatch centers from the bill and
32 changes the title to reflect the change.

33 2. It changes the references to crisis stabilization unit services to crisis residential
34 services.

35 3. It removes the requirement for including cost-settlement contracts to reflect current
36 budgeting practice and to allow for different reimbursement models for new or additional
37 federal funding for mobile crisis response services.

1 4. It replaces the appropriations and allocations sections.
