The amendment requires the 27 28 Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Conservation to update the service center 29 community classifications in 2023 and every 5 years thereafter; post the service center 30 community listing on its publicly accessible website; submit a report, by February 15, 2023, 31 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters 32 detailing where population growth is occurring and projected to occur; and submit the periodic evaluation report required to be provided by statute to the joint standing committee 33 34 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters. The amendment requires the 35 department, the Maine State Housing Authority and the Department of Economic and Community Development to share data useful in assessing and determining growth 36 37 management policies and standards. 38
