An Act To Prohibit a Public Utility from Terminating or Disconnecting Service to a Public Safety Facility without Advance Notice and Approval

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §102, sub-§12-B is enacted to read:
3 4	12-B. Public safety facility. "Public safety facility" has the same meaning as in Title 30-A, section 5222, subsection 14-A.
5	Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §719 is enacted to read:
6	§719. Termination of utility services for public safety facilities
7 8	The following provisions apply to termination or disconnection of a public safety facility's utility service.
9 10	1. Termination. A public utility may not terminate or disconnect a public safety facility's utility service unless the public utility has:
11 12 13	A. Provided written notice to the governmental entity using the public safety facility of the public utility's intention to terminate or disconnect the facility's utility service at least 60 days before the termination or disconnection date;
14 15	B. Obtained from the commission written authorization to terminate or disconnect the public safety facility's utility service; and
16 17	C. Obtained from the Department of Public Safety written authorization to terminate or disconnect the public safety facility's utility service.
18 19 20 21 22	2. Rules. The commission may adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. In adopting rules pursuant to this subsection, the commission shall consult with the Department of Public Safety and a statewide organization representing municipal interests in the State.
23	SUMMARY
24 25 26 27 28	This bill requires a public utility, before it terminates or disconnects a public safety facility's utility service, to provide 60 days' advance written notice to the public safety facility of its intent to terminate or disconnect utility service and to obtain written authorization from the Public Utilities Commission and the Department of Public Safety to terminate or disconnect the utility service.
