An Act to Increase the Minimum Teacher Salary

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13406,** as amended by PL 2019, c. 343, Pt. UU, §1, is repealed.
 - **Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §13407,** as amended by PL 2021, c. 441, §1, is repealed.
 - Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §13408 is enacted to read:

§13408. Minimum salaries beginning in 2024-2025 school year

Each school administrative unit shall establish a minimum salary for certified teachers and career and technical education teachers as follows:

- 1. School year 2024-2025. For the school year starting after June 30, 2024, the minimum salary is \$42,500;
- 2. School year 2025-2026. For the school year starting after June 30, 2025, the minimum salary is \$45,000;
- 3. School year 2026-2027. For the school year starting after June 30, 2026, the minimum salary is \$47,500;
- **4. School year 2027-2028.** For the school year starting after June 30, 2027, the minimum salary is \$50,000; and
- 5. School years beginning in or after 2028. For the school year starting after June 30, 2028, the minimum salary for certified teachers and career and technical education teachers must increase by multiplying the amount of the salary by the cost-of-living adjustment. For each subsequent year, the previous year's adjusted minimum salary for certified teachers and career and technical education teachers must increase by multiplying the amount of the adjusted minimum salary by the cost-of-living adjustment. For purposes of this subsection, "cost-of-living adjustment" means the Chained Consumer Price Index for the 12-month period ending June 30th of the preceding calendar year divided by the Chained Consumer Price Index for the 12-month period ending June 30th of the calendar year in which the adjustment is effective and "Chained Consumer Price Index" has the same meaning as in Title 36, section 5402, subsection 1.

A school administrative unit shall provide to the department annually on or before October 1st the number of certified teachers and career and technical education teachers eligible for incremental salary increases as defined in section 15689, subsection 7-A, paragraph A.

- **Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §15689, sub-§7-A,** as amended by PL 2021, c. 441, §2, is further amended to read:
- **7-A.** Adjustment for minimum teacher salary. Beginning in fiscal year 2020-21 2024-25, the commissioner shall, in accordance with this subsection, increase the state share of the total allocation to a qualifying school administrative unit by an amount necessary to achieve the minimum salary for certified teachers and career and technical education teachers established in section 13407 13408.
 - A. As used in this subsection, unless the context otherwise indicates, "qualifying school administrative unit" means a school administrative unit that the commissioner determines to have a locally established salary schedule with a minimum teacher salary

of less than \$40,000 \$42,500 in school year 2019-2020 2024-2025. As used in this 1 2 subsection, unless the context otherwise indicates, "incremental salary increases" 3 means the incremental increases in the salaries of certified teachers and career and technical education teachers employed by a qualifying school administrative unit in 4 school year 2019-2020 2024-2025 necessary to meet the minimum salary requirements 5 of section 13407 13408 from fiscal year 2020-21 2024-25 to fiscal year 2022-23 2026-6 27. 7 8 B. The commissioner shall allocate the funds appropriated by the Legislature in 9 accordance with the following. 10 (1) The amount of increased funds provided to qualifying school administrative units under this subsection must be the amount necessary to fund the incremental 11 salary increases specified in this subsection. 12 13 (2) The number of certified teachers and career and technical education teachers 14 eligible for incremental salary increases in a qualifying school administrative unit for a fiscal year must be based on the information supplied to the department 15 pursuant to section 13407 13408 in that fiscal year. 16 17 The increased funds provided under this subsection must be issued to 18 qualifying school administrative units as an adjustment to the state school subsidy for distribution to the certified teachers and career and technical education 19 20 teachers. Qualifying school administrative units shall use the payments provided 21 under this subsection to provide salary adjustments to those certified teachers and career and technical education teachers eligible for incremental salary increases. 22 23 The department shall collect the necessary data to allow the funds to be included in a qualifying school administrative unit's monthly subsidy payments beginning 24 no later than February 1st of each fiscal year. 25 26 (4) Funding for incremental salary increases in fiscal year 2020-21 2024-25 must 27 be based on data submitted to the department and certified by school administrative units as of October 1, 2019 2023. 28 29 C. This subsection is repealed July 1, 2026. Sec. 5. Effective date. This Act takes effect June 30, 2024. 30 **SUMMARY** 31

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This bill incrementally increases minimum teacher salaries beginning in 2024 and

provides limited supplemental funding to pay for those increases.
