An Act To Increase the Supplement for Certain National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certified Teachers in Maine

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13013-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2011, c. 702, §2, is
 further amended to read:

1. Department of Education salary supplement. Notwithstanding any other 4 provision of law, the Department of Education shall provide a public school teacher or a 5 teacher in a publicly supported secondary school who has attained certification from the 6 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, or its successor organization, with 7 an annual national board certification salary supplement for the life of the certificate. The 8 salary supplement must be added to the teacher's base salary and must be considered in 9 the calculation for contributions to the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. If a 10 nationally certified teacher is no longer employed as a teacher, the supplement ceases. 11 The amount of the salary supplement is: 12

13 A. For fiscal year 2012-13, \$2,500;

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- 14 B. For fiscal year 2013-14, \$2,750; and
- C. For fiscal year 2014-15 and succeeding years, except for a teacher under
  paragraph D, \$3,000-; and

17D. For fiscal year 2020-21 and succeeding years, for a teacher who is employed in a18school in which at least 50% of students qualify for a free or reduced-price lunch19under chapter 223, subchapter 7 during the year that the supplement is provided,20\$9,000.

SUMMARY

This bill increases, from \$3,000 to \$9,000, the supplement paid to a teacher who has attained certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a school in which at least 50% of students qualify for a free or reduced-price lunch during the year that the supplement is provided.
