14 15	<b>1-C. Financial assistance.</b> The following provisions apply to grants of temporary financial assistance to veterans.

The bureau may provide a grant of temporary assistance not to exceed \$2,000 to a veteran currently a resident of this State who has filed a valid claim for a veteran's pension, pending notification of the award of such a pension. For purposes of this paragraph, "claim for a veteran's pension" means a claim filed with the United States Department of Veterans Affairs pursuant to 38 United States Code, Chapter 15.
21 22 23	B. The bureau may provide a grant of temporary assistance not to exceed \$2,000 to a veteran currently a resident of this State who demonstrates to the bureau's satisfaction a financial need and suffers an emergency, including but not limited to:
24 25	(1) Damage to that veteran's home due to fire, flood or hurricane that is not fully compensable by insurance;
26	(2) Illness or the illness of an immediate family member; or
27	(3) Hardship that would result in the veteran becoming homeless.
28 29 30 31 32	C. A veteran who requests temporary assistance under this subsection and is denied such assistance by the bureau may request a reconsideration and review of this decision. Requests for reconsideration of a claim must be reviewed by the director and the commissioner or the commissioner's designee, and the decision after the reconsideration is final and may not be appealed to a court.
33 34	D. The bureau may contract with an organization incorporated in the State as a nonprofit corporation in accordance with Title 13-B or an organization with tax-

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1 2	exempt status under 26 United States Code, Section 501(c) for the purpose of providing temporary financial assistance to veterans as described in this subsection.
3	A contract authorized under this subsection may provide only for the distribution of
4	direct temporary financial assistance to veterans and may not provide for
5	compensation for personnel costs of the organization, funding of positions of
6	employment within the organization or administrative costs of the organization
7	except those directly related to the distribution of temporary financial assistance
8	grants to veterans.
9	E. The department may adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted

31	SUMMARY
32	The bill amends the definition of "eligible veteran" with respect to eligibility for
33	burial in the Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemetery System. That definition of "eligible
34	veteran" is also employed in current law to define veteran eligibility for temporary
35	financial assistance. This amendment, which is the unanimous report of the committee,

amends the statute governing the temporary financial assistance program by removing the
