1 SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the committee and replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment requires the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance to conduct a review and evaluation of a mandated health benefit proposal requiring health insurance carriers to provide coverage for all contraceptive drugs, devices and products approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration without any deductible, coinsurance, copayment or other cost-sharing requirement. The bureau is required to submit the review to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health coverage, insurance and financial services matters no later than January 30, 2023, and the committee is authorized to report out legislation to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature based on the results.
