SUBCHAPTER 4			
FARMERS DROUGHT RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM			
<u>§220-A. Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program</u>			
<b>1. Grant program established.</b> The Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program, referred to in this section as "the program," is established in the department to assist farmers in the State to overcome the adverse effects of drought conditions by providing grants in accordance with this section.			
<b>2. Eligibility.</b> A farmer in the State may apply for a grant under the program if the farmer needs to establish a source for irrigation water or needs funding to adopt healthy soils best practices as defined in Title 12, section 351, subsection 5 to alleviate the risk of crop losses due to current or future threat of drought. The source for irrigation water must be sustainable, environmentally sound and affordable.			
<b>3.</b> Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program Fund. The Farmers Drought Relief Grant Program Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund to provide funding to achieve the purposes of the program. The fund consists of any funds received from private and public sources. The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and

accounts. Any balance remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year must be carried
forward to the next fiscal year.

4. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to implement the program. The rules must
include grant eligibility requirements, grant application and award procedures and grant
funding limits. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as
defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

7 Sec. 2. Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to examine ways to streamline permitting new sources of water for farmers. The Department 8 of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Agriculture, Food and Rural 9 Resources shall work with the Department of Environmental Protection and the Maine 10 Land Use Planning Commission and other appropriate agencies to examine the permitting 11 process for farmers seeking to secure permits for new sources of water for irrigation and to 12 13 develop recommendations, including suggested legislation, to streamline the permitting process. No later than January 1, 2023, the department shall submit a report with findings 14 15 and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters. The joint standing committee may 16 submit a bill to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature relating to the subject 17 18 matter of the report.
