The Maine Town and City Clerks' Association is in Support of LD 218 and we thank you for the opportunity to outline our comments for your Committee:

Very simply stated, the polling place needs to be a neutral free zone, free from politics and campaigning. Voters need to feel they can walk into the polls and not have any influence whatsoever. We feel it is the responsibility of municipal clerks to protect the polling place and ensure voters have a campaign and political free zone.

The solicitation and collection of campaign contributions within the polling place area should not be allowed. It is difficult for campaign workers to ask for donations without using influential language in support of their candidate and discussing the merits of their campaign. The ability for a campaign to set up a table inside the building where voting is occurring leads to the impression and perception that voter influence is taking place. We need to avoid the projection of this image. Campaigns have the ability to recruit donations in numerous of ways; setting up at the polls should be off-limits.
