

**Maine Revised Statute Title 28-A, Chapter 21:
WHOLESALE LIQUOR PROVIDER**

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28-A §501. WHOLESALE LIQUOR PROVIDER; DEFINITION

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, "wholesale liquor provider" means an entity or entities contracted by the State as an agent of the State for the purpose of providing wholesale spirits and fortified wine to establishments licensed by the State to sell spirits and fortified wine for off-premises consumption. 28-A §502. WHOLESALE LIQUOR PROVIDER PROHIBITED FROM HOLDING AN AGENCY LIQUOR STORE LICENSE

A wholesale liquor provider is prohibited from holding a retail license to sell liquor for off-premises consumption. [2003, c. 20, Pt. SS, §4 (NEW); 2003, c. 20, Pt. SS, §8 (AFF).]

28-A §503. SALE TO ON-PREMISES LICENSEES PROHIBITED

A wholesale liquor provider shall sell spirits and fortified wine to establishments licensed by the State to sell liquor for off-premises consumption. A wholesale liquor provider is prohibited from selling spirits and fortified wine directly to establishments licensed by the State to sell liquor for on-premises consumption. [2003, c. 20, Pt.
