

§18503. Examination or tests

The examination or tests to determine whether a member is disabled under section 18501 are governed as follows. [PL 1985, c. 801, §§5, 7 (NEW).]

1. Agreed upon health care provider. The examination or tests must be conducted by a health care provider mutually agreed upon by the chief executive officer and member claiming to be disabled. [PL 2021, c. 277, §32 (AMD); PL 2021, c. 277, §45 (AFF); PL 2021, c. 548, §45 (REV).]

2. Agreed upon place. The examination or tests must be conducted at the health care provider's office or facility or at a place mutually agreed upon by the chief executive officer and member claiming to be disabled. [PL 2021, c. 277, §32 (AMD); PL 2021, c. 277, §45 (AFF); PL 2021, c. 548, §45 (REV).]

3. Costs. The costs incurred under subsections 1 and 2 must be paid by the retirement system. [PL 2021, c. 277, §32 (AMD); PL 2021, c. 277, §45 (AFF).]
