

§320-T. Definitions

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

1. Farm and sea to school learning program. "Farm and sea to school learning program" means a program that incorporates agricultural-based education, hands-on learning through school gardens and increased access to local foods through local procurement by school meal programs; improves access to local seafood sourcing by school meal programs; and provides seafood education in schools. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

2. Fund. "Fund" means the Maine Experiential Education Program Fund established in section 320-V. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

3. Program. "Program" means the Maine Experiential Education Program established in section 320-U. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

4. Public school. "Public school" has the same meaning as in Title 20-A, section 1, subsection 24. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

5. School administrative unit. "School administrative unit" has the same meaning as in Title 20-A, section 1, subsection 26. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]

6. Student. "Student" means an individual enrolled in prekindergarten to grade 12 in a public school or school administrative unit. [PL 2025, c. 183, §1 (NEW); PL 2025, c. 183, §4 (AFF).]
