## **An Act To Amend the Laws Dealing with the Posting of Gas Prices**

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

**Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1661-B, sub-§1**, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 83, §2, is amended to read:

**1. Posting required.** A retail seller of fuel to be used by vehicles on public highways shall ~~post~~ make clearly visible on each pump the price of the fuel available at that pump, either by posting a sign of no less than 64 square inches and in a manner that is clearly visible to a driver approaching the pump or by a price reading, digital or analog, built into the pump that must reflect the actual price of the fuel pumped. The pump must have a sign of no less than 64 square inches on it if either the price on the pump differs from the price posted on the roadside sign due to a difference in grade of fuel or service or the retailer does not have a roadside sign. On multi-grade pumps, the posted price ~~shall~~ must be for the lowest priced unleaded regular gasoline. ~~The sign should~~ posting must indicate the difference in price for full-service, mini-service and self-service if more than one grade of service is available at that pump.
